Miscellaneous

I. Bulletin

- A. The <u>Bulletin</u> shall be issued before the students register, and shall contain the courses to be offered in the year for which they are registering.
- B. Courses shall be listed in the <u>Bulletin</u> in accordance with the following regulations.
