## **CAMP DIRECTORS**

Over the past 5 years, Rochester Softball has been on a steady incline, each season proving better than the last. One constant over these past few seasons has been, now head coach, Margaret Yerdon. She assisted the Yellowiackets to a 33-12 finish for the 2008-2009 season, setting a single-season victory record for the third consecutive year. In addition, the Yellowjackets made their third straight NCAA Division III playoff appearance. The Yellowjackets took second place in the competitive UAA Conference and repeated as the Liberty League Champions for the third straight year, posting a perfect 8-0 record. A very impressive eleven players were named All-Liberty League and five received All-UAA honors. Beth Ameno and Lindsay Macaluso, who will be returning as a junior, earned First Team NFCA All-Region honors. Kate McLean and Kim Grimes, in only their first season as Yellowjackets, earned NFCA All-Region honors as well. Team highlights include Ameno becoming only the second Yellowjacket to earn NFCA All-American honors. She was also named First Team All-UAA and First Team All-Liberty League, as well as Liberty League Pitcher of the Year. On the mound Ameno finished 23-9, appeared in 35 games, struck out 254 batters in 201.1 innings and posted a 1.25 ERA. Shortstop Lindsay Macaluso was named the Liberty League Player of the Year, First Team All-Liberty League, and First Team All-UAA. Kim Grimes was named the Liberty League Co-Rookie of the Year, First Team All-Liberty League, and First Team All-UAA. Katie McLean and Juliana Nicholson received Second Team honors in both leagues and six other players earned honors as well.

Coach Yerdon was a pitcher for Binghamton University, where she is still the career record holder in strikeouts (431) and earned run average (1.40). Yerdon earned Division II NFCA All-Region honors in 1999 and was the NECC All-Conference Pitcher of the Year in 1999 and 2000. In 2002, she earned America East All-Conference honors. Following graduation in 2002, Yerdon served as a graduate assistant pitching coach at Binghamton University, before joining the Rochester softball staff in 2004. Yerdon is joined by Assistant Coach, Jena Robertson. Robertson, a former Yellowjacket, earned NFCA All-Region honors all four years. Following graduation in 2007, Robertson served as a volunteer assistant coach for the Yellowjackets.

### CLINIC INSTRUCTION

The Rochester Softball Clinics are designed to broaden players' knowledge and understanding of hitting and pitching. Hitting instruction will break down the mechanics of the swing and use specific drills to develop good fundamentals. Pitching instruction will go through detailed progressions from wrist snaps to full motion. The beginning session will mostly focus on mechanics and will introduce change-up as skill level permits. The advanced session will introduce different spins, including drop, curve, screw, rise and change-up as skill level permits. Each session will also recommend drills to vary workouts and to target certain problems.

After a successful career as a high school coach in at Chenango Forks, Decosse became the pitching coach at Binghamton University in 1995.
