Flyers and Posting Guidelines Reminder

Don't forget, there are various bulletin boards throughout Wilson/Douglass/Genesee/Spurrier for advertising campus activities. Six of these are reserved for flyers submitted to the Campus Information Center. A maximum of six letter-size flyers or four tabloid-size flyers can be brought to the Campus Information Center, located on the 2nd floor of Wilson Commons, and they will be posted on the six reserved boards.

The remaining bulletin boards are open for anyone to hang flyers on. Multiple flyers of the same type, flyers covering other flyers or hanging off the edges of the bulletin board, and flyers that are not stapled in all four corners will be removed.

Areas like the clock tower, painted walls in buildings, and glass on windows and doors are sensitive to adhesive and other materials used to hang posters, which can damage these surfaces. If your organization or department is found posting in such areas and damage occurs when removing postings, a fee may occur to repair the damage.

No posting is allowed in the bridge between Wilson Commons and Douglass Commons or the tunnel between Douglass Commons and Rush Rhees Library at any time.

Boar's Head: Student Host Application

The Boar's Head Dinner is one of the University's oldest and most beloved traditions. On behalf of the Student Activities Board, we are delighted to extend to you an invitation to act as a student host and join over six hundred members of the University of Rochester community at the 90th Annual Boar's Head Dinner!

The dinner will be held at 7 p.m. in the Feldman Ballroom, Douglass Commons on Thursday, December 4. The dinner will be preceded by a private reception at 5:30 p.m. for student hosts and their faculty/staff co-hosts. As a student host, you will sit at the head of a table and welcome your fellow students, faculty, and administrators. You will be expected to ensure that enough food is served to the entire table and to be courteous and helpful to your table's server. It is your responsibility to invite a faculty/staff member from the University of Rochester to serve as a faculty/staff co-host at your table.

Student hosts will be reserved a ticket in advance at a discounted price. Your faculty/staff member and one (1) guest will also be granted a ticket to the dinner at a discounted rate. The <u>student host application</u> is due by 5 p.m. on Wednesday, November 12.

Spring 2026 Advanced Reservations: Practices and Rehearsals

The advance reservation process for the spring semester will begin with the Practices and Rehearsals template on November 5. Organizations that have practices or rehearsals can place requests for up to 6 hours of reserved time until November 19. If your organization places more than 6 hours of requests, only 6 hours will be approved. This advance reservation period is ONLY for practices and rehearsals – Meetings, Study Hours, or other event types will be denied. As a reminder, all advance reservation requests are processed on a best-fit basis.

The Major Event requests for the Spring 2026 semester have already reopened. More information can be found on the advance reservation webpage.

What You Need to Know About SOAR 2025

All recognized student organizations are evaluated through the Student Organization Annual Review (SOAR). The self-report for student organizations will open the week before Thanksgiving Break. A separate e-mail will be shared with student leaders once the self-report form opens.

The deadline for this year's self-report will be 11:59 p.m. Sunday, January 11. Only one self-report can be submitted per organization, and your entire executive board must be involved in completion of the self-report. This is not something that should be completed by one executive member. The period under review is January 2025 through December 2025. Student organizations recognized during the 2025-2026 proposal period do not need to complete a SOAR self-report.

SAAC Supplemental Funding Deadlines

Fall request submission deadlines for eligible student organizations to apply for SA supplemental funding are:

- Large Scale Activities due no later than Sunday, November 2.
- Small Scale Activities due no later than Sunday, November 16.

Connect with your advisor to determine if your activity would be considered "Large Scale" or "Small Scale". Don't forget to get in touch with your organization's assigned student accountant regarding the submission. For planning purposes, please note there will not be a SAAC Supplemental Hearing meeting on Tuesday, November 25 due to Thanksgiving Break.

Don't forget! You may submit <u>Supplemental Requests</u> during the fall semester for your spring activities. It helps to plan ahead for spring semester activities, as the spring semester is also budgeting season for SA Budgeted Groups.
