

Medical Student Curricular Remodel

Currently undergoing a major curricular remodeling, with increased emphasis on:

- Collaborative care
- Technology in medicine
- Professional identity formation



Residency Training: Quality and Safety of Patient Care Focus

Restructuring clinical training so trainees are best positioned to succeed in tomorrow's health care settings.

- 12 Strong Memorial Hospital units integrated residents into interprofessional quality improvement teams to improve clinical quality and safety outcomes
- Launching Quality Academy to deepen the bench of clinicians trained and dedicated to quality improvement efforts



Basic Science PhD Curricular Remodel

- Revamped core interdepartmental courses into a single module-based course, allowing for:
 - o Greater use of small group-based learning
 - o Increased emphasis on self-directed learning





Expanding Educational Opportunity in Oral Health

- Exploring new degree programs, including an integrated Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery/MD Program and Doctor of Dental Medicine
- Recent education-related grants:
 - HRSA grant \$3.6M aimed to train 100 dentists to be able to provide care to patients with developmental disabilities.
 - HRSA grant \$1M to develop curriculum in urgent care dentistry.





Meeting the Community's Nursing Needs

- Implementing consistent clinical nursing education and trainings across the regional affiliates, including:
 - Expanding distance-learning programs
- Growing community partnerships to increase nurse practitioner enrollment capacity in areas of identified need (ex. Mental Health).



Cross-cutting or Foundational Efforts

Institute for Innovative Education (IIE)-

- Miner Library merged with the CEL under the IIE (renovations underway)
- ECHO tele-mentoring programs centralized under the IIE
- CEL playing key role to implement consistent clinical education and trainings across the regional affiliates




Centrality of Ph.D. Programs

- Education & Training. Faculty are here because they love to teach & mentor.
- Program Size. SMD is grad studentcentric; we have >2x as many PhD students as postdocs. SMD matriculates about 60-70 PhD students a year and has a steady-state class size of ~350 students.
- Impact. Grad students are essential to our research mission & to our ability to attract and retain outstanding faculty.




School of Nursing: Research Priorities

 - Being developed by a start-up company, Health Care Originals.
 - Peer-led Asthma Self-Management for Adolescents (PLASMA)
- **Interactive text messaging system** to help teens and their parents with daily asthma management



What will it take?


- Strategic hires (e.g., Wilmot Chair, Paula Vertino);

Total URMC System Analytic Cases



Golisano Children's Hospital

- •The region's only children's hospital, serving as the referral center for all seriously ill or injured children from the 17-county Finger Lakes region.
- •Approximately 1 in 12 babies born in the region start their lives in our NICU, which is the only Level IV NICU in the region.
- Ranked as a Top 50 children's hospital by US News & World Report in Neonatology, Neurology/Neurosurgery, and Nephrology





Wilmot Cancer Institute

- Cancer is the second leading cause of death in New York and the U.S.
- Wilmot Cancer Institute features an 86-bed cancer center with 11 outpatient locations throughout the Finger Lakes region.
 - o One of New York's largest blood and marrow transplant programs.
 - The Rochester area's only ACOS-accredited breast cancer center.
 - Robust cancer survivorship program.
 - Offers clinical trials of new therapies and options that may not be available anywhere else upstate.





Cardiology

- Heart Disease is the leading cause of death in New York and the U.S.
- UR Medicine Cardiology is the region's leader in cardiology care, research, and training.
- Program highlights include:
 - The only cardiac transplant service in upstate New York
 - One of nation's leaders in in the development of Ventricular Assist Devices (VADs)
 for the treatment of heart failure
 - The region's only Atrial Fibrillation Center, providing advanced treatments that often cure atrial fibrillation permanently
 - o Our rapid treatment of heart attacks is among the fastest in the nation





Neuromedicine


- •Stroke and Alzheimer's disease are the fifth and sixth leading cause of death in the U.S.
