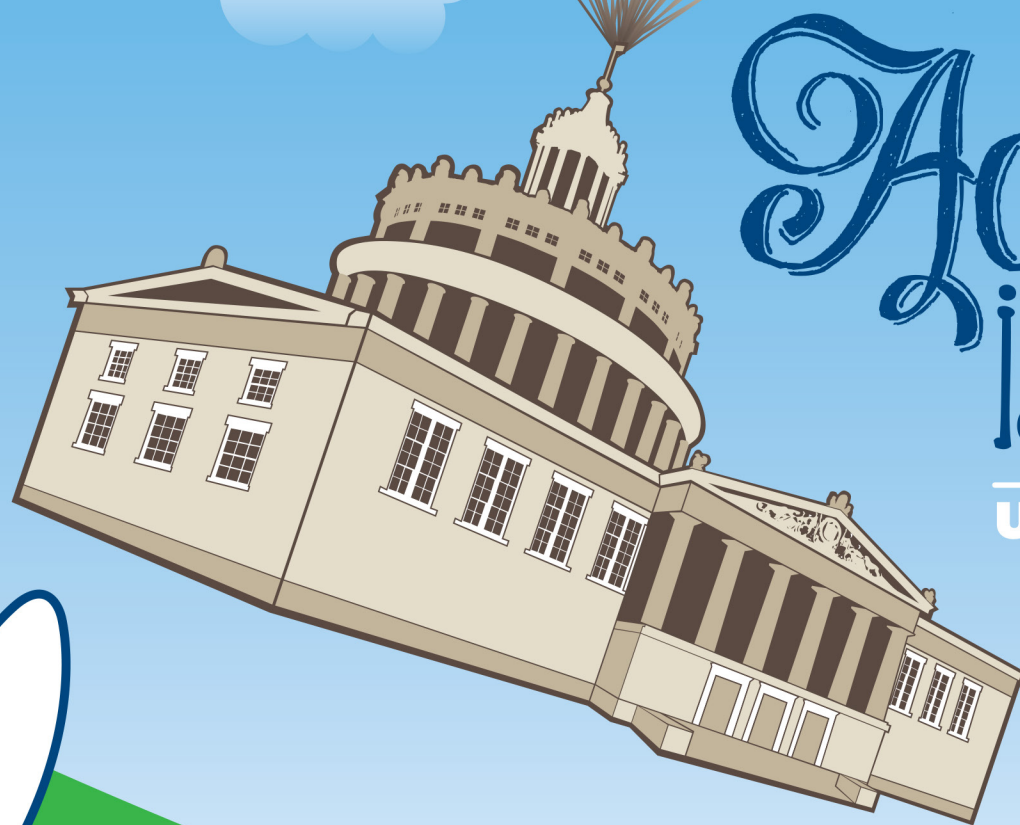
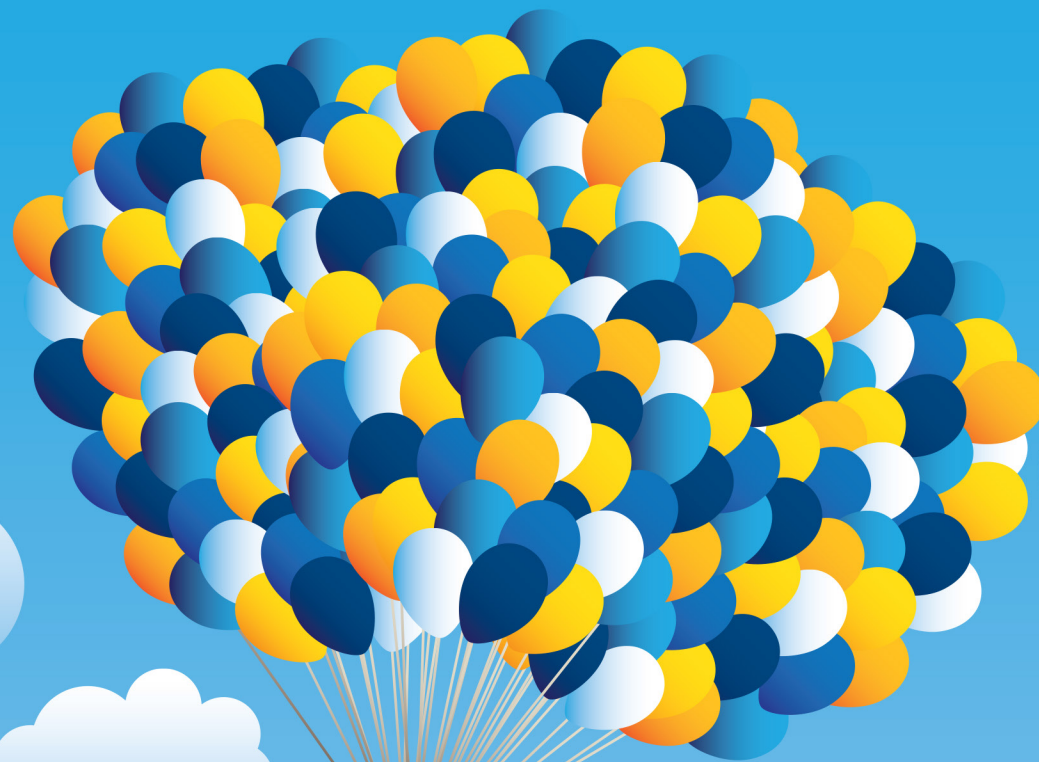

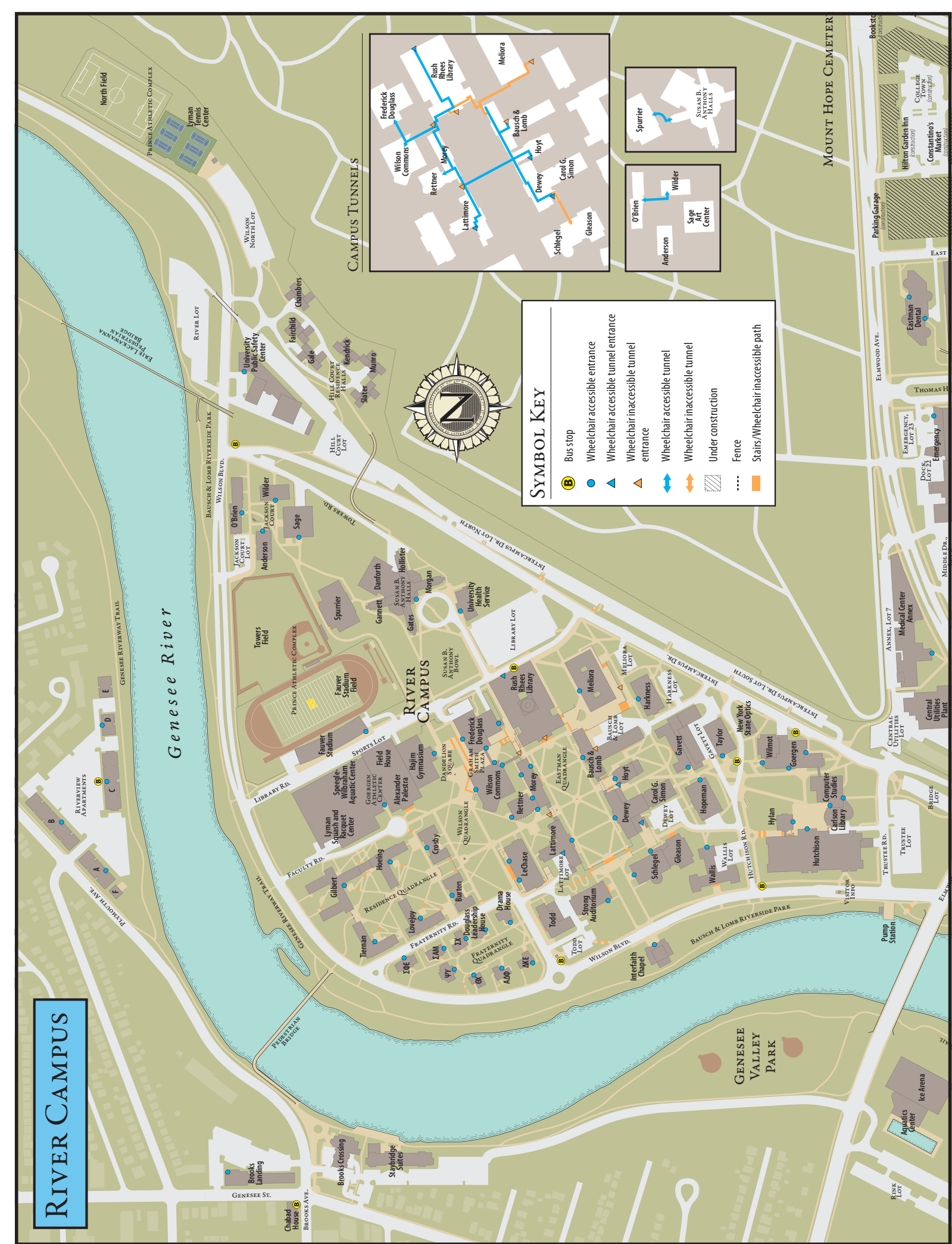

Welcome to the University of Rochester,

Dear Class of 2019,

Welcome! Today marks the formal beginning of your academic journey as a college student.
