Transportation to Polling Places on Election Day

The **Committee for Political Engagement** (CPE) makes getting to the polls easy on Election Day.

Polls will be open from **6AM-9 PM** on Election Day, **November 6**. For students who are registered using your UR address (excluding Riverview), your polling site is **Saunders Research Building** on **Crittenden Blvd** (near the Medical School).

To get to the polling site between **11:45 AM-1 PM, 2:00 PM-3:25 PM, 4:50 PM-7:30 PM**-Take the **Blue Line to Whipple Park via Hospital** (you can view the bus schedule at http://tinyurl.com/URblueline -Get off at the **Helen Wood Hall stop**

To get to the polling site between **10 AM-11:30 AM, 1:15 PM-2:00 PM, 3:30 PM-4:30 PM, 7:30 PM:** - Request a ride from the Committee for Political Engagement. Shuttles will run based on need and depart from ITS. **http://tinyurl.com/Electiondayrides**

You can always walk, too! It takes about 15 minutes each way.

After you've voted, join the Committee for Political Engagement to watch the returns and enjoy free food beginning at 9PM in Wilson Commons, Hirst Lounge.

Better Communication For Your Organization: Create a mailing list with similar functionality to the old CCC, the first step is to go to *Roster* and *Manage Positions* to create a position called "Mailing List #1" or a more specific position title like "Publicity Group". Then you can assign any member to this position, along with their default position. Now you can go to *Roster* and *Messaging* to choose this special position 'group' and email your members the way you wish.

You can also communicate to your members by creating a newsletter as you did before, creating a News Article from the News tab for your organization. Create a new News Article and post the link to the News Post for only members to view. Any questions email colin.knapp@rochester.edu.
