Continuing Student Scholarships for Undergraduates

The Continuing Student Scholarship was created in 2007 to recognize and reward the outstanding achievements of current University of Rochester students. This highly selective scholarship is awarded to approximately 30 students each year. Award amounts range up to \$2,500 and are given for one academic year. Past Continuing Student Scholarship winners may reapply for the scholarship in future years.

James A. Chin Award

This award is given to honor the memory of James A. Chin, Jr. and as a tribute to his efforts and accomplishments here at the University of Rochester. Jim, a 1993 graduate, had the debilitating disease FSH Muscular Dystrophy; however, he never let this constant obstacle interfere with his strong commitment to improving both himself and the community around him. Jim was active in many diverse areas of University life, consistently demonstrating both honor and integrity as he strived to achieve his goals. Jim was also very active in the Greek community, particularly in his own fraternity, Sigma Nu, where he held the offices of Social Chair and Interfraternity Council representative. The purpose of this award is to recognize those students who exemplify these characteristics for their accomplishments and their contributions to the University and the Rochester community.

Each Thursday afternoon during the academic year, all undergraduate students receive the Weekend Highlights, a brief email listing of events scheduled for the up-coming Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. Events listed on the Weekend Highlights email must be open to the entire student body and have detailed event information on file at the Common Connection. Inclusion in the email must not be the program's primary means of advertisement and should compliment other marketing efforts.

To submit your event for possible inclusion in Weekend Highlights, email your information by **Tuesday at 12pm** to <u>connect@sao.rochester.edu</u>, or in CCC. Be sure to include the following information: **Event Name, Descrip-tion, Date, Time, Location, Price, Transportation Information and Sponsorship.**

CCC Monthly Tip

Did you know that after you submit your **event for registration**, that you can easily check for updates or messages about that submission? After you log into the CCC, click on 'My Involvement' on the top bar, then click on 'Submissions' to follow the progress of any submission. Click on the magnifying glass on the row of the item you wish to review to be taken directly to your submission.

Whether it be a form, election or event registration, all are tracked in one easy location! This is especially important for those groups who need event approval from Event Support, Facilities, Security, the Sanitarian, and your advisor.
