3rd Floor Chalkboard Policy

- I. To reserve the 3rd Floor Lounge Chalkboard in Wilson Commons, please submit a request using the online 3rd Floor Lounge Chalkboard Request Form located on the Forms Tab on the WCSA website. All 3rd Floor Lounge Chalkboard requests are to be submitted at least 5 business days prior to the start of the requested reservation date. Reservations are made on a first-come, first-serve basis. Upon approval, a confirmation email will be sent to the individual who submitted the initial request. In the case the request cannot be accommodated, an email will be sent to the individual who submitted the initial request. Please be aware that groups are not guaranteed use of the chalkboard.
- 2. The 3rd Floor Lounge Chalkboard is exclusively available to WCSA recognized student groups and University departments. Chalking by an unrecognized group or outside entity will be erased. The chalkboard is reserved in I week time slots. Groups, organizations, and departments can use the chalkboard to promote singular or a large amount of events and activities.
- 3. Confirmed organizations and departments must use chalk provided by WCSA. Chalk may be picked up and returned to the Common Connection.
- 4. All displays must clearly state the sponsoring organization/department.
- 5. Student organization displays must be approved by the adviser before they chalk.
- 6. Wilson Commons Student Activities is not responsible for the erasing or tampering of information. However, chalking of any content that is deemed inappropriate by WCSA will be removed immediately. Inappropriate content includes drug paraphernalia and slanderous language.
- 7. All chalking will be erased by midnight on the last day of the reservation.

Promotional Opportunities for Spring

Requests for Promotional Opportunities (banners, info tables, flex tables, Expression Wall, Display Case, Donation Box, Chalkboard, and Battery Operated Candles) for Spring 2015 can be submitted starting on November 15.
