

Student Organization Annual Review

Student Organizations advised by Wilson Commons Student Activities, the Rochester Center for Community Leadership, Athletic & Recreation, and the Interfaith Chapel are reviewed and evaluated on an annual basis. The SOAR consists of the self-report, Leadership Training attendance, CCC site review, and advisor feedback among other things. All organizations required to submit a self-report as part of SOAR will receive an email with more details by the end of the month. A couple of key dates are:

- Student organizations must submit their self-report by noon on December 6th, 2019.
- All Activity Reflections and/or Assessment forms for the review period must be submitted by the last day of classes (December 11th). If organizations have a planned study break after December 11th, activity reflections for these study breaks are due by the last day of exams (December 20th).
- The self-report questions will be available during the first week in November and the online form will be able to accept submissions beginning at 5pm on Thursday, November 7th.
- There will be SOAR Training/Information Sessions available for Organizations to attend:
 - o Wednesday, November 13th from 6:00-6:45pm
 - o Friday, November 16th from 3:00-3:45pm

All organizations advised by Fraternity and Sorority Affairs complete Expectations for Excellence Annual Report. Documents are due through email to excellenceGA@rochester.edu by 11/7/19 at 11:59pm.

85th Annual Boar's Head Student Host Applications

One of the University's oldest and most beloved traditions, the Boar's Head Dinner began in 1934. The dinner recalls the spirit of English court dinners, such as those served at Queens College, Oxford University, during the Middle Ages.

On behalf of the Student Programming Board, we are delighted to extend to you an invitation to act as a student host and join over six hundred members of the University of Rochester community at the 85th Annual Boar's Head Dinner! The dinner will be held at 7 PM in the Feldman Ballroom, Douglass Commons on Thursday, December 5, 2019. The dinner will be preceded by a private reception at 5:30 p.m. for student hosts and their faculty/staff co-hosts. As a student host, you will sit at the head of a table and welcome your fellow students, faculty, and administrators. You will be expected to ensure enough food is being served to the whole table and to be courteous and helpful to your table's server. It is your responsibility to invite a faculty/staff member from the University of Rochester to serve as a faculty/staff co-host at your table. Student hosts will be reserved a ticket in advance at a discounted price of \$10. Your faculty/staff member and one (1) guest will also be granted a ticket to the dinner for \$10 each
