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## **Constitution Updates due this month**

If you are interested in updating your constitution before the end of the academic year, the Constitution Update Interest form must be submitted by March 20<sup>th</sup> and the Constitution Final Submission Form must be submitted by April 4<sup>th</sup>. ## Things to know when transacting in SOFO

- When transacting for upcoming programs and events, we need 2 to 3 business days to process a green form that has been filled out correctly and completely.
  - Incomplete green forms will delay the processing time.
  - Appointments for Online orders can be scheduled once the green form has been submitted for an appointment at least 2 to 3 business days out – please use this link to schedule: https://calendly.com/online-orders
- Payments by check are processed on Tuesdays and Fridays, they are ready for pick up after 2:30pm. Please indicate if you would like the check mailed or picked up. (Please note, only the Business Manager can pick up checks from the SOFO office). Any green forms that do not indicate the distribution method will be mailed.
- If your organization is traveling to a location that is greater than 25 miles from Rush Rhees library, you must follow the Group Travel process. Approved Group Travel forms are prefilled based on the transactions that are indicated on the Group Travel Pre-Approval form and stamped with the Transportation Approval stamp. These forms can be located in folders organized by Mission Category in the hanging wall file in the SOFO office. They are typically ready 1 business day after your Group Travel Pre-Approval submission has been moved to "Required Modifications" status.

While we understand that last minute requests may occur, we ask that you plan accordingly and keep these instances to a minimum, as there is no quarantee that we can accommodate them.

#### **Copyrights regarding Visuals & Graphics**

It's important to understand copyright laws when creating publicity, logos, and other items for your organization. DO NOT simply do a Google search! Stealing images, video, music, and artwork is a serious offense and can result in legal action. Copyright materials are forbidden to use without the owner's permission, and many items are not properly labeled as such. Only utilize graphics that are clearly tagged with their usage capabilities. There are a multitude of FREE resources with images that are open content. #### **Event Timeline**

Student organizations must stick to strict timelines in order to ensure the success of their events. Failure to follow event registration timelines will result in event denial by the organization's advisor.

Events with over 100 people—or ones that are held in the Strong Auditorium, May Room, or Feldman Ballroom—must meet all registration criteria **30 business days before the event**.

All other events must meet registration criteria 10 business days before the event.

#### **Activity Reflections**

Did you know activity reflections are read by 1) your advisor 2) SA Administrative Review Committee and most importantly 3) incoming officers? When filling out an activity reflection be sure to provide details. This is your one opportunity to share HOW and WHY things went well or didn't go so well. This allows for your organization to make SMART goals about what you do.
