


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Winter Activities Fair Update

The Winter Activities Fair will be going virtual on CCC at two times on **Friday, January 21st from 2-3:30pm EST and 5-6:30pm EST**. Below is a preview of what the virtual fair will look like:





Edit, Update, and Activate Your Virtual Booth

To have your organization included in the fair, Officers will need to log on to CCC and follow these steps. Many booths still have set-ups from previous virtual fairs, so please be sure to update your content before activating. Booths must be activated before January 21 to be included in the virtual fair.

1. Access Your Booth

From your group Dashboard, go to More Tools > Virtual Fairs. Click the "Booth Settings" button on the listing for this fair. Check out <u>this video</u> to see how to build your virtual booth. (Unable to view the first link? <u>Try this one</u>.)

2. Add Content

Help prospective members get to know your organization! Students can filter by "Most Active" — which means the more content you add, the higher you will appear on the list of groups. Types of content you can include:

- a. General Info: Add a slogan, share what you're all about, and note if you want students to join your mailing list (by becoming a Contact). Select relevant Interests, Industries, and/or Sports so that students exploring their passions can be matched with your organization in a list of "Suggested Groups."
 - i. Pro tip: If you want people to join as a full member right away, add your group's QR code (found on your Dashboard) to the content in the box labeled "Present your group in a few words."
- b. Communications: Select if you want to participate in a Group Chat and/or One-on-One Chat with interested students visiting your booth. Assign members to facilitate the chat during the live event times. Live Zoom links are also a great way to facilitate more personal audio/video connections!
 - i. Group Chat = single room where all participants can see all messages sent during the fair (great for Q&A).
 - ii. One-on-One Chat = assigned on a rotating basis with interested students.
- C. **Media:** Make your booth stand out with officer introductions, images, and videos from past events. Include a link(s) to your website (make sure it's up to date!) and upload documents.

3. Activate to Launch

Once you've completed your setup and/or updates, select the **Activate Booth Checkbox.** This will ensure your booth appears in the virtual fair. Forgot something or made a typo? It's okay, you can go back and edit your booth as needed.

After the fair, you will be able to see who clicked the "I'm Interested" button for your organization by going to your Members List > Contacts and then filtering by the Member Tag with the name of the fair. You can then follow up with more information about joining and your upcoming meetings and events.

Spring 2022 Activity Updates

Below are the guidelines for a temporary pause on all in-person extracurricular student activities until February 1 that was issued by the UR President's Office.

- The pause applies to all student organizations (College Student Organizations, Fraternity & Sorority, and Residential Life).
- All in-person meetings, practices, rehearsals, and activities cannot occur until the pause has been lifted which is at least until February 1st. Please note:
 - No action is needed from your organization to cancel reservations or CCC activity registrations. WCSA will cancel confirmed VEMS reservations and remove CCC activities as needed for dates occurring before the pause has been lifted.
 - You can no longer utilize spaces that were reserved for use during the pause and your activity cannot occur in-person. This includes executive board meetings, general member meetings, general interest meetings, and in-person activities of any kind.
- Your organization may conduct virtual activities. To do so, please submit an activity registration and select "virtual" as your event type.
- If you cannot adapt your activity to a virtual format and would like to reschedule for later in the semester, please submit a new VEMS request.
- Transactions in the SOFO office will be limited during this time.

Please work with your advisor should you have any questions or concerns about your activities.
