Student Life Spaces Updates

Over winter break the two spaces were received updates: Gym in Spurrier and Havens Lounge. In **Spurrier Gym**, basketball hoops were replaced with retractable hoops which are on a newly-outlined NCAA-sized court. The floor was refinished and re-lined to include the new basketball court, four badminton courts, a volleyball court, and lines for fencing. The renovation is still in progress, but the gym is now re-opened for use during <u>building hours</u>. Please help protect the new floor by refraining from wearing wet/dirty and/or hard soled/high heeled shoes in the gym.

In Havens Lounge, new acoustic panels were installed on the walls to eliminate echos -

impoving capability for meetings and rehearsals. The AV was updated with a wall mounted cabinet (to eliminate issues with items getting unplugged as the cart was moved around), air media as a connection option, and the addition of a wireless microphone (which can be signed out from Common Connection).

Resource Agreements & Constitution Deadlines

Resource Agreements

All officers of College Student Organizations were notified on Friday, January 28th regarding the rollout of Resource Agreements for Organizations established prior to 2020. **Agreements are available to sign by your Organization's President now through Sunday, February 13th at Common Connection (201 Wilson Commons).** Common Connection's operation hours can be located here. If you are unable to stop by in-person by the deadline, please contact Wilson Commons Student Activities. An admin of both the Student Organization Review Board (SORB) and The Administration & Review Committee (ARC) will work with you to sign the document electronically.

Resource Agreements left unsigned on Monday, February 14th will result in a freeze on your CCC site - meaning you will not be able to access forms for activity registration, virtual EMS reservations, or transact with SAAC/SOFO.

Constitution Deadline

This year's Constitution Interest Form deadline is **Friday, March 4th**. The form will officially close for the academic year at 11:59 p.m. EST.
