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2013 Edward Peck Curtis Awards for Excellence in Teaching by a Graduate Student

<u>Help earn money for your favorite department and graduate student!</u> Any full-time graduate student in the University who assists in teaching undergraduates is eligible. The graduate student receives \$500. The department in which the teaching was done will also receive \$250 for improvements in undergraduate course materials or laboratory equipment.

Nominations should be sent to Pat McLane, 2-314 Simon/Dewey Hall, by Friday, March 15th.

Work with the department chair or the faculty member that supervised the graduate student to provide them with a supporting letter of recommendation.

Please make sure you are checking your room confirmations (especially for weekly meetings and rehearsals) to see if there are any variances in location for any weeks.

Photos of these spaces are available on Virtual EMS.
