Did you know that you can create forms that can be submitted and approved to your organization? These forms can be used for submissions of content or requests of the organization. In order to get started, go to your Organization's page and click on the 'Forms' button, then click 'Manage Forms', then 'Create Form'. The screen you see now contains the properties of the form, fill these out then click 'Save and Add Questions'. From here you can create your own custom form with the controls on the left. After creating the form, go back to 'Manage Forms' and click on the 'Publish' link next to the form you created. You can copy the link to wherever you may want to advertise the form.
