SAAC/SOFO End of Semester Update

The Students' Association Appropriation Committee (SAAC) will finish hearing supplemental requests for the semester on Tuesday, December 13th, and will resume again on Tuesday, January 17th. You may continue to submit <u>Supplemental Funding Request</u> forms over break, and they will be reviewed at the beginning of next semester. The <u>Green Form</u> will be open for continued use during the winter break to facilitate payments for outstanding transactions that

occurred during the Fall semester. If you have any questions or concerns, please <u>reach out to</u> <u>your student accountant</u>.

Information regarding Student Organization budgeting for next year will be available in January.

Activity Registration Updates

As a reminder, all Student Organizations who are planning activities must abide by all of the <u>Activity Registration Policies</u>. Please submit your activities through CCC early and on time. If you are unsure how to submit an Activity Registration, check out this <u>how-to video</u>.

Starting in Spring 2023, **GMMs**, **Weekly Meetings**, **Chapter Meetings**, **Practices**, **and Rehearsals** <u>without services</u> no longer need to be registered in CCC. You can still register them if you wish to advertise your activities to students on CCC. **Reservations will still need to be submitted for space through VEMS**. General Interest Meetings (GIM) should continue to be registered, and all other activity registration requirements remain in effect.

Activity Reflections

Ticket Reconciliation

If your organization has been waiting on a ticket reconciliation file from SAAC/SOFO, and it is not received by your organization by Friday, December 16th, please submit your reflection form anyways. Ticket files will be uploaded at a later date. Please reach out to your organization's advisor if you have questions.

Best Practices: Reviewing Activity Registration Submissions

If you need to review your Activity Registration submission in CCC:

- 1. Within your "My Activity Menu" select "My Surveys/Forms."
- 2. Locate the form submission you would like to review.
- 3. Click the three dots on the right side of the submission, then select "View." Do not select the hyperlink.
- 4. Once you have reviewed, do not hit "Save" simply close or exit from the screen.
- 5. Indicate in the CCC chat what changes were made.

Lastly, if your Activity Registration submission has been placed into a Requires Modifications status, you must edit your submission by going through your "My Activity Menu" - not through your organization's dashboard. This will ensure your submission is resubmitted, rather than saved.

Apply to be a 2023-24 Orientation Leader

Hone your leadership skills as an Orientation Leader! The Office of Orientation and First-Year Programs is now accepting applications for the 2023-24 Orientation Leader position, which begins in May 2023. In this role, you will be responsible for mentoring a cohort of incoming first-year and transfer students - helping them and their families navigate academics, student life, and campus resources as an incoming Yellowjacket. You'll have the opportunity to develop and lead virtual and in-person programs for new students, both ahead of their arrival and during their first year on campus.

This is a paid, year-round position, with 30-40 hours of work during the summer and 10 hours of work offered per month during the academic year. On-campus housing is provided in the summer. Register for an upcoming info session here and learn more on the Orientation and
