Get Inclusive: Title IX Required Training

All student leaders were required to complete the Get Inclusive training, provided through the Title IX Office, by October 31st. The deadline has been extended to 11:59 p.m. Sunday, November 10th. Not all current officers made it to the list. Ask your advisor if you are unsure if you need to complete the training.

Organizations with officers who do not complete this training by the November 10th deadline, will have their VEMS access revoked on Wednesday, November 13th. The training consists of 20-minutes for sexual misconduct and about 60-minutes for diversity, equity, and inclusion for students. All student leaders who are required to take this should have received an email from Get Inclusive (support@lms.getinclusive.com) with information on how to complete the training.

If you are participating in the Medallion Leadership Program, you can receive a Civic Engagement workshop credit by completing the <u>Level 1 Workshop Reflection</u> form. Please include Get Inclusive training as the workshop title.

What You Need to Know About SOAR 2024

All College Student Organizations are evaluated through the Student Organization Annual

Review (SOAR). The self-report for student organizations will open the week before

Thanksgiving Break. A separate e-mail will be shared with student leaders once the self-report

form opens. The deadline for this year's self-report will be 11:59 p.m. Sunday, January 12th.

Only one self-report can be submitted per organization and your entire executive board must

be involved in completion of the self-report. This is not something that should be completed by

one executive member. The period under review is January 2024 through December 2024. Student organizations recognized during the 2024-2025 proposal period do not need to

complete a SOAR self-report.

SAAC Supplemental Funding Deadlines

Fall request submission deadlines for eligible student organizations to apply for SA supplemental funding are:

- Large Scale Activities due no later than Sunday, November 3rd.
- Small Scale Activities due no later than Sunday, November 17th.

Connect with your advisor to determine if your activity would be considered "Large Scale" or "Small Scale". Don't forget to get in touch with your <u>organization's assigned student accountant</u> regarding the submission. For planning purposes, please note there will not be a SAAC Supplemental Hearing meeting on Tuesday, November 26th due to Thanksgiving Break.

Don't forget! You may submit Supplemental Requests during the fall semester for your spring activities. It helps to plan ahead for spring semester activities, since the spring semester is also budgeting season for SA Budgeted Groups.

As a separate reminder, please note all Financial Transaction Request (Green Form) submissions require <u>2-3 business days for processing</u>. They cannot be processed in <u>24-hours or less</u>.

One Community and Meliora Vision & Values Grants

Is your organization in need of funding? See if the Burgett Intercultural Center's (BIC)

One Community Grant or the Meliora Vision & Values Grant applies to your program or activity.

For best consideration, please ensure that your proposal for funding is received by the selection committee by Wednesday, November 6th. The next upcoming deadline will be in the spring semester; Wednesday, February 5th.

Advance Reservations: Practices and Rehearsals

The Advance Reservation period for Practices and Rehearsals is open! Organizations who have practices or rehearsals can place requests for up to 6 hours of reserved time until November 12th. If your organization places more than 6 hours of requests, only 6 hours will be approved. This period is ONLY for practices and rehearsals – Meetings, Study Hours, or other event types will be denied. As a reminder, all advance reservation requests are processed as best fit. Messy Activities Policy Reminder

As a reminder to all organizations, messy activities are only permitted in Hirst Lounge and outdoor spaces. Messy activities are classified as any event that has the potential to require additional clean up, and/or has the potential to damage furniture, floors, or walls. Common messy activities include, but are not limited to: Pie-in-the-face fundraisers, events involving paint, events with glitter, and tie-dye events. The Boar's Head Dinner is one of The University's oldest and most beloved traditions. The dinner will be held at 7 p.m. in the Feldman Ballroom, Douglass Commons on Thursday, December 5th. The dinner will be preceded by a private reception at 5:30 p.m. for student hosts and their faculty/staff co-hosts. As a student host, you will sit at the head of a table and welcome your fellow students, faculty, and administrators. You will be expected to ensure enough food is being served to the whole table and to be courteous and helpful to your table's

server. It is your responsibility to invite a faculty/staff member from the University of Rochester to serve as a faculty/staff co-host at your table.

Student hosts will be reserved a ticket in advance at a discounted price. Your faculty/staff member and one (1) guest will also be granted a ticket to the dinner at a discounted rate. The student host application is due by Wednesday, November 10th at 5:00 p.m.
