Endowment Payout Rate

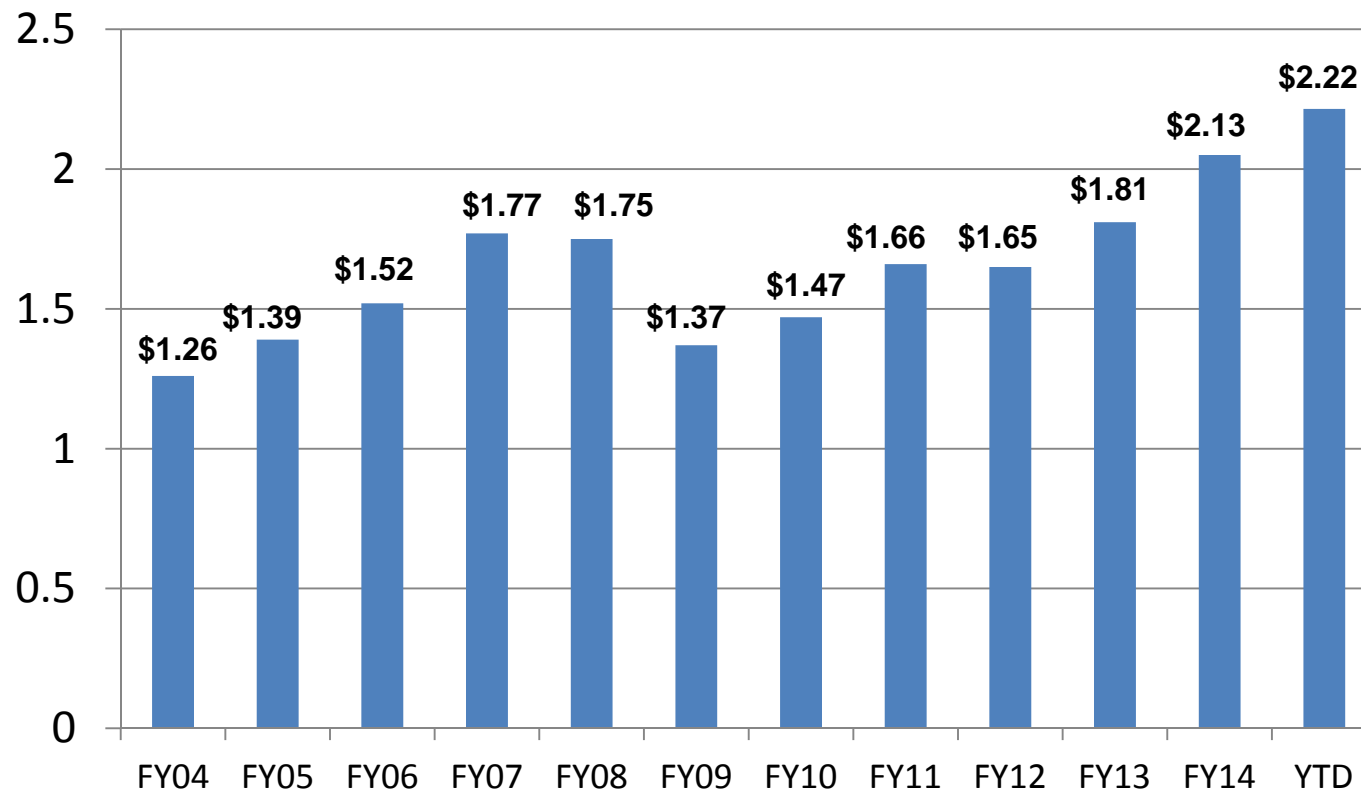
