
## What is the First-Year Residential Experience?

## **Your First-Year Team**



**Resident Advisors (RA)** are undergraduate students who live on each residence hall floor. RAs are selected and trained to serve as a campus resource person, mediator, and policy enforcer. RAs plan social and educational activities.

**D'lions** are a long serving club on campus. Each member is an undergraduate student who also live on the halls. They are assigned to assist incoming students with their transition to campus life specifically in the area of social engagement. Additionally, D'Lions promote campus spirit, and participate in community service throughout the Rochester area.

**First-Year Fellows** First-Year Fellows are upper-class students who live in first-year residence halls to increase first-year student academic success through coaching and mentoring.
