Students who have resided in <u>any country other than those listed below</u> in the <u>past 5 years</u> must complete the Tuberculosis Test (PPD) section on the Health History and Immunization Form.

Students entering the United States who have only resided in the countries listed below over the past 5 years are <u>not</u> required to have a tuberculin skin test.
