General notes:

- Any of these masters programs could be taken by:
 - O WHU master's students who are interested in obtaining a U.S. Master's degree in addition to their WHU Master's degree (and could do so by staying in Rochester for only 4-9 months depending on the chosen program, most likely during their second year if they time the rest of the WHU coursework strategically)
 - WHU doctoral students who are interested in obtaining a U.S. Master's degree in addition to their WHU Ph.D. degree (and could do so by staying in Rochester for only 4-9 months depending on the chosen program, sometime after the first year in their WHU doctoral program)
- New York State allows up to 10 credits of relevant graduate coursework to be transferred from other institutions into a Master's degree; we are willing to allow WHU students to

transfer as many credits as possible credits from courses taken in WHU, provided we agreed in advance about what WHU courses can be automatically transferred in each of the Master's program identified in this document. Tuition for courses taken in WHU is going to be paid to Wuhan (not to the University of Rochester).

- Transferring courses taken at WHU will effectively provide students the equivalent to a 30% discount on the tuition they would otherwise have to pay for a Master's degree at UR-Warner, as they will only have to pay for 20-26 credits (depending on the program) instead of 30-36 credits. At the current rate of about \$1,500 per credit, this discount can be worth as much as \$15,000.
- Transferring courses from WHU will also allow students to reduce the time they need to spend in Rochester which will save them additional costs, and also make it easier for them to complete a degree from the University of Rochester AND a degree from WHU.
- It will be up to WHU whether students can count some of the courses taken in Rochester towards their WHU degree doing so will make it even easier and more appealing to students to pursue two degrees (one from WHU and one from Rochester); the University of Rochester has no restrictions about this.
